All the ppl are in a deep hole of pity


Palestine we pray for you



Stabrag please try not to fight and bee Evan if you are a fighting white, So put down your gun, And try to have fun, Because we can make the world


the truth etruth would the truth o please do






UTS WE for Listening haring birds ouths are sor speaking Eating dessert are for bumping. not trying to huse and cking
